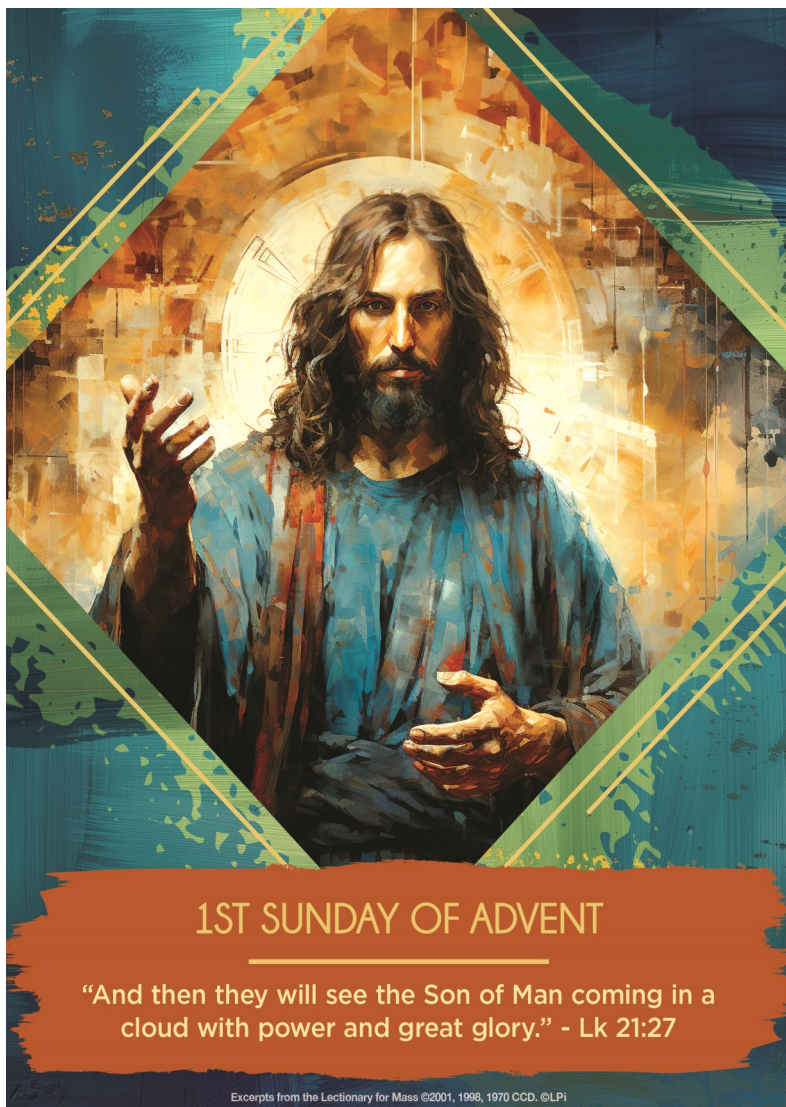

Peninsula Cluster Advent Penance Service: December 5th 6:30pm – 8:30pm at St. Joseph.

Parish Registration: To register in one of our cluster parishes, please pick up a registration form at Mass and turn it in to the parish office, or contact your parish office directly.

Baptism: For infants and children under the age of 7: a pre-baptismal preparation process for parents is required, and the sacrament is celebrated on a scheduled basis. Please contact your Deacon to register for preparation.

RCIA (Becoming Catholic): The RCIA process is for unbaptized persons, ages 7 and older, and those who were baptized in another Christian tradition. The process is one of conversion and formation and people are welcomed into the process year-round. Contact one of our Deacon's for more information.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered at St. Joseph on Wednesdays: 5pm & Saturdays: 3-3:45pm, St. Vincent on Wednesdays: 12:30 & Saturdays: 3:30pm and St. Mary's on Sundays: 8:45-9:15am.

Anointing of the Sick: Celebrated after masses when requested or by appointment.

Marriage: Engaged couples should contact the parish at least six months in advance of a desired wedding date.

Monday, December 9th is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and is a Holy Day of Obligation. Mass will be celebrated at Saint Joseph at 9am, Saint Mary at 12:05pm, and Saint Vincent de Paul at 6pm

Coffee with Clergy: All are welcome to grab a cup of coffee with Fr. Dillon on **Thursdays from 10-11am at Buckroe Coffee**. This is an informal event each Thursday to learn about topics of your choice and to pick a priest's brain about any subject you want. **First gathering will be Thursday, December 5th!**

Advent Day of Recollection: Father Dillon will be leading an Advent Day of Recollection at **Saint Joseph's on December 21st from 10am-2pm**. On this mini retreat, we will seek to hear the voice of God as we meditate upon the mystery of the Incarnation and prepare ourselves for Christmas. Please bring your own lunch.

Advent Book Study: Join Father Dillon in a 3-week advent book study beginning on **December 7th**. We will be reading and discussing Carol Houelander's *The Reed of God*. The group will meet on **Saturday mornings from 7:30am-8:45am at Saint Joseph's Little White House**. Please sign up using the forms in the back of the church or in the parish halls (Dec. 7,14,21).

Ephesian Bible Study: Father Dillon will be leading an 8-part bible study on the Letter to the Ephesians starting **Dec. 30th**. We will explore how this book of the Word of God helps us better understand the nature of marriage, the purpose and role of the Church, the preeminence of grace in God's plan, and the reality of spiritual warfare. We will gather on **Mondays at Saint Mary's parish hall from 7pm-8:30pm**. Please sign up using the forms in the back of the church or in the parish halls (Dec. 30 Jan. 6, 13, 20, 27, Feb. 3, 10, 17).

A Note from Danny, Music Director for St. Joseph and St. Mary Star of the Sea: Please join us for Christmas! Are you interested in singing Christmas music and/or playing handbells or hand chimes for Christmas? Singers (ages twelve and up) are invited to join our rehearsals on Tuesday nights during Advent—from 6:30-8pm at St. Joseph. The choir will sing for 10pm mass on Christmas Eve as well as 8am mass on Christmas Morning at St. Joseph.



And if you're interested in playing handbells or hand chimes, please consider helping us in that way—**no experience is necessary**. Anyone ages 8 and up is invited to play. Also invited are those who have already been to music rehearsals for the nativity play during Faith Formation classes. We'll practice at St. Joseph from 5:30 to 6:15 on Tuesday nights during Advent. Those playing handbells will play for 4pm Christmas Eve mass at St. Joseph. And those playing hand chimes will play for 5:30pm mass at St. Mary Star of the Sea. Thanks very much for helping us to make Christmas extra merry and bright this year!

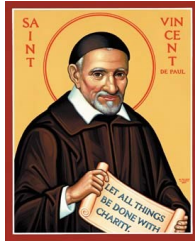
