

Call for Service from the Music Ministries of Saint Joseph and Saint Mary Star of the Sea Churches: Please Consider Helping Us to Prepare for Easter!

As we approach Lent, our music ministries are looking for volunteers to join us for Holy Week and for the Easter Season. Singers (ages twelve and up), please think about joining us on **Tuesday nights** for choir rehearsals at **6:30 at Saint Joseph.** Choir will prepare special pieces for the Triduum as well for Easter morning (April 20th) and we are very much in need of helpers in order to make these pieces happen! And, whether or not you can come on Tuesdays, you are also invited to come to the **cantors' rehearsal at noon on Thursdays at Saint Mary.** At this rehearsal, we focus on the hymns and mass parts for each upcoming Sunday and holy day, and these practices will be especially important as we get closer to Easter.

In addition to singing, another option for helping out this year is to play handbells or hand chimes. If this option piques your interest, please do think about coming to the weekly bell choir rehearsals during Lent on Tuesday nights beginning March 11th at 5:30pm at Saint Joseph. Ringers (ages eight and up), know that no previous experience is necessary, but do only consider serving in this role if you will be able to participate in the masses on **Holy Thursday** and on **Divine Mercy Sunday** at our parishes this year. **Handbells** will be played during masses at **Saint Joseph:** for the 7pm mass on Holy Thursday (April 17th) and for the 4pm Saturday night mass (April 26th) on Divine Mercy weekend. **Hand chimes** will be played during masses at **Saint Mary** for the 5pm mass on Holy Thursday and for the 9:30am mass on Divine Mercy Sunday.

Christian Formation

D.C. Weekend Pilgrimage: Father Dillon will be leading a weekend pilgrimage to Washington, D.C. **March 14th-16th.** We will visit and tour the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception (the largest Catholic church in North America), the Saint John Paul II National Shrine, and the Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land in America. The cost is \$355/person. This includes bus transportation, lodging, and dinner. Pilgrimage of Hope: In celebration of the Jubilee year, Father Dillon and Deacon Dave will be leading a Pilgrimage of Hope, **June 16th-20th.** We will pray at the tombs of Saints Katherine Drexel, John Neumann, and Elizabeth Ann Seton. We will visit the Shrines of the North American Martyrs in Fultonville, NY and the National Shrine of Divine Mercy in Stockbridge, MA. The cost is \$999/person. This includes bus transportation, lodging, and most meals. 2025 is the Jubilee Holy Year,

the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord, an "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church." The concept of "Jubilee" has its origins in the Book of Leviticus (chapter 25) as a special year of reconciliation, pilgrimage, and coming home. Pope Francis has designated the 2025 Holy Year as a time to renew ourselves as "Pilgrims of Hope."



School of Prayer: Our Catholic Faith is full of rich and diverse ways to pray and connect with God. Starting **February 24th,** a School of Prayer will be held at **Saint Vincent de Paul on Monday nights from 7pm-8:30pm.** Each week we will learn about a different prayer method and practice praying together. Topics include praying at Adoration, the Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, Lectio Divina, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, Mental Prayer, Prophesy and Personal Intercession, Physical Healing, and Interior Healing.
