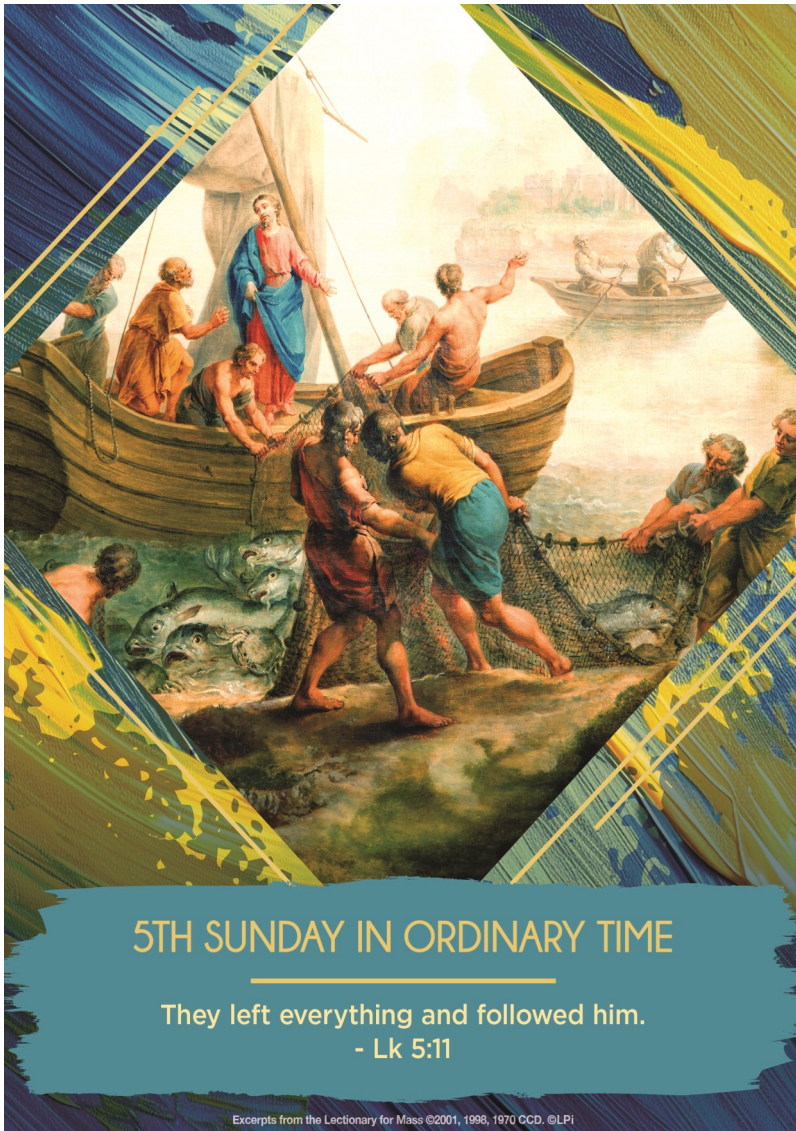

**Parish Registration:** To register in one of our cluster parishes, please pick up a registration form at Mass and turn it in to the parish office, or contact your parish office directly.

**Baptism:** For infants and children under the age of 7: a pre-baptismal preparation process for parents is required, and the sacrament is celebrated on a scheduled basis. Please contact your Deacon to register for preparation.

**RCIA (Becoming Catholic):** The RCIA process is for unbaptized persons, ages 7 and older, and those who were baptized in another Christian tradition. The process is one of conversion and formation and people are welcomed into the process year-round. Contact one of our Deacon's for more information.

**Reconciliation:** The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered at St. Joseph on Wednesdays: 5pm & Saturdays: 3-3:45pm, St. Vincent on Wednesdays: 12:30 & Saturdays: 3:30pm and St. Mary's on Sundays: 8:45-9:15am.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Celebrated after masses when requested or by appointment.

**Marriage:** Engaged couples should contact the parish at least six months in advance of a desired wedding date.

**Bulletin:** Submissions for bulletin must be submitted to Kim Primo ten days prior to the first date of inclusion. Bulletin items will be included two weeks prior to event with advanced notice included 2 months prior. All submissions subject to approval/editing.

# Christian Formation

**D.C. Weekend Pilgrimage:** Father Dillon will be leading a weekend pilgrimage to Washington, D.C. **March 14th-16th.** We will visit and tour the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception (the largest Catholic church in North America), the Saint John Paul II National Shrine, and the Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land in America. The cost is \$355/person. This includes bus transportation, lodging, and dinner. **Pilgrimage of Hope:** In celebration of the Jubilee year, Father Dillon and Deacon Dave will be leading a Pilgrimage of Hope, **June 16th-20th.** We will pray at the tombs of Saints Katherine Drexel, John Neumann, and Elizabeth Ann Seton. We will visit the Shrines of the North American Martyrs in Fultonville, NY and the National Shrine of Divine Mercy in Stockbridge, MA. The cost is \$999/person. This includes bus transportation, lodging, and most meals. ## 2025 is the Jubilee Holy Year,

the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord, an "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church."

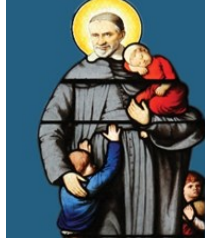

**Clothes Closet Ministry:** The closet served over 100 people in January, a month of snow, ice and very cold winds, a challenge for both the homeless and our dedicated volunteers. During the month, several bags of very nice and much needed donated winter items were distributed, and our volunteers also personally made needed purchases to help out. Thank you to all who continue to contribute to help our backdoor guests.

**Toiletry items**-- deodorant, shampoo, soap, toothpaste, toilet paper and small packs of toilet tissue.

**Back Door Ministry:** In January, the kitchen served 1,000+ meals to those coming to the "backdoor" for lunch. Though there have been some "chilly" days, the number of those coming to us in need of a hot meal remains high.

**Food Pantry Ministry:** The Food Pantry served 24 families, feeding 68 individuals, and assisted 74 homeless individuals, making a total of 142 people served in January. The pantry is in need of: **cereal, sandwich meats (bologna, ham, turkey), spaghetti noodles and spaghetti sauce, jelly and bread.** Donations of cloth bags, two-handled paper bags and plastic bags in which to place food items to carry out to families are very much needed.

The pantry appreciates all who continue to donate and bring food items.

At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. **But- membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish.**

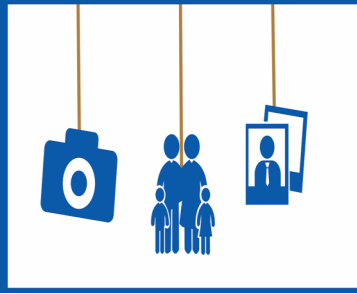
Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. **Census numbers can determine how many priests and deacons are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.**

Registration shows you belong. It is also important for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. **Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.**

**Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.**

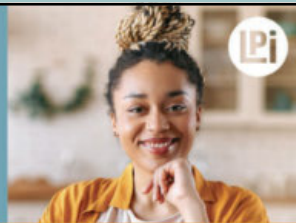
