

Parish Registration: To register in one of our cluster parishes, please pick up a registration form at Mass and turn it in to the parish office, or contact your parish office directly.

Baptism: For infants and children under the age of 7: a pre-baptismal preparation process for parents is required, and the sacrament is celebrated on a scheduled basis. Please contact your Deacon to register for preparation.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) The OCIA process is for unbaptized persons, ages 7 and older, and those who were baptized in another Christian tradition. The process is one of conversion and formation and people are welcomed into the process year-round. Contact one of our Deacon's for more information.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered at St. Joseph on Wednesdays: 5pm & Saturdays: 3-3:45pm, St. Vincent on Wednesdays: 12:30 & Saturdays: 3:30pm and St. Mary's on Sundays: 8:45-9:15am.

Anointing of the Sick: Celebrated after masses when requested or by appointment.

Confirmation Preparation: Tuesday, March 11 at SJ-5pm

School of Prayer: Our Catholic Faith is full of rich and diverse ways to pray and connect with God. A School of Prayer will be held at **Saint Vincent de Paul on Monday nights from 7pm-8:30pm.** Each week we will learn about a different prayer method and practice praying together. Topics include praying at Adoration, the Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, Lectio Divina, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, Mental Prayer, Prophesy and Personal Intercession, Physical Healing, and Interior Healing.

Coffee with Clergy: Join Fr. Dillon for a cup of coffee at this informal event to learn about topics of your choice and to pick a priest's brain about any subject you want. This event will be held at **Buckroe Coffee** on Thursdays from 10-11am: March 13, and March 27.

LENT

Save the Dates: Cluster Penance Service on Thursday March 20th and our Lenten Mission March 24th-26th.

Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. Fasting is a form of penance and abstinence is a form of self discipline, both of which help us turn away from sin and toward Christ. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat. For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

SAINT PATRICK in a stained-glass window in St. Benin's Church, Kilbennan, County Galway, Ireland, Patrick is depicted with a shamrock. Legend credits Patrick with teaching the Irish about the doctrine of the <u>Holy Trinity</u> by showing people the <u>shamrock</u>, a three-leafed plant, using it to illustrate the Christian teaching of three persons in one God. The earliest written version of the story is given by the botanist <u>Caleb Threlkeld</u> in his 1726 Synopsis stirpium Hibernicarum, but the earliest surviving records associating Patrick with the plant are coins depicting Patrick clutching a shamrock which were minted in the 1680s.

Saint Patrick, born at the end of Roman rule in Britain, was a fifthcentury Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland.

Known as the "Apostle of Ireland", he is the primary patron saint of Ireland. Patrick's confession states he was not an active believer in his youth, and considered himself in that period to be "idle and callow". According to the Confession of Saint Patrick, at the age of sixteen, he was captured by

a group of Irish pirates, from his family's Villa at "Bannavem Taburniae". They took him to Ireland where he was enslaved and held captive for six Years. Dur-

ing which time he worked as a shepherd and strengthened his

relationship with God through prayer, eventually leading him to deepen his faith. The raiders who kidnapped him introduced him to the Irish culture that would define his life and reputation.

March 17, popularly known as Saint Patrick's Day, is believed to be his death date.
