

Parish Registration: To register in one of our cluster parishes, please pick up a registration form at Mass and turn it in to the parish office, or contact your parish office directly.

Baptism: For infants and children under the age of 7: a pre-baptismal preparation process for parents is required, and the sacrament is celebrated on a scheduled basis. Please contact your Deacon to register for preparation.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) The OCIA process is for unbaptized persons, ages 7 and older, and those who were baptized in another Christian tradition. The process is one of conversion and formation and people are welcomed into the process year-round. Contact one of our Deacon's for more information.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered at St. Joseph on Wednesdays: 5pm & Saturdays: 3-3:45pm, St. Vincent on Wednesdays: 12:30pm & Saturdays: 3:30pm and at St. Mary's on Sundays: 8:45-9:15am.

Anointing of the Sick: Celebrated after masses when requested or by appointment.

Marriage: Engaged couples should contact the parish at least six months in advance of a desired wedding date.

Bulletin: Submissions for bulletin must be submitted to Kim Primo ten days prior to the first date of inclusion. Bulletin items will be included two weeks prior to event with advanced notice included 2 months prior. All submissions subject to approval/editing.

Footsteps of St. Vincent's Outreach Ministries

Currently, very helpful support for our ministries are monetary donations. The number of persons we serve is increasing, especially with the arrival of warm temperature, and your gifts allow us to purchase what is urgently needed at any specific time. Please make checks payable to St. Vincent and put the name of the ministry/ministries to which you are donating in the memo section.

Your support is greatly appreciated as we continue to serve the less fortunate coming to us from our local community.

Clothes Closet Ministry: In the month of April, the clothes closet served 102 adults. The number of persons remained about the same as in March, though the closet was closed one week for Easter vacation. We do expect our numbers to increase significantly as the summer months are fast approaching.

Thank you to everyone supporting our need for clothes, shoes and underwear.

You are wonderful! Here is a list of our current needs.

- Men's underwear, sizes small & large
- Jeans, sizes 32, 34 and 36
- Summer hats
- Shoes
- Toilet paper

Food Pantry Ministry: In April, the pantry served 20 families, feeding a total of 55 people and also served 102 of our homeless with small non-perishable food items and toiletries. Current helpful and often requested food pantry items include jelly (to accompany jars of peanut butter), grits, cereal, Vienna sausages (flip-top cans), crackers and Pop Tarts. Toilet paper and toiletry items are also needed. A monetary donation is very helpful for this ministry, allowing perishable items, i.e. milk, eggs, bread or other needed items to be purchased for families. Thank you for helping.

Back Door Ministry: In April, 835 hot meals were served to our hungry guests coming to us for lunch. Tubs of margarine and containers of instant tea and lemonade are helpful items needed by the kitchen.

Fr. Romy wishes to thank all who contribute to St. Vincent's Social Action Ministries.

Come Play in the Dirt: As the growing season progresses, weeds have had a good start. So, in an effort to keep them under control, flower bed weeding will occur on Fridays from 10am to noon. 

Parish Registration: Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish- they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. **But- membership requires signing up, for-mally enrolling yourself in a parish.**

Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. **Census numbers can determine how many priests and deacons are assigned to a church, what benefits and obliga**-



tions the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also important for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. **Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.**

Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.


