Parish Registration: To register in one of our cluster parishes, please pick up a registration form at Mass and turn it in to the parish office, or contact your parish office directly.

Baptism: For infants and children under the age of 7: a pre-baptismal preparation process for parents is required, and the sacrament is celebrated on a scheduled basis. Please contact your Deacon to register for preparation.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) The OCIA process is for unbaptized persons, ages 7 and older, and those who were baptized in another Christian tradition. The process is one of conversion and formation and people are welcomed into the process year-round. Contact one of our Deacon's for more information.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered at St. Joseph on Wednesdays: 5pm & Saturdays: 3-3:45pm, St. Vincent on Wednesdays: 12:30pm & Saturdays: 3:30pm and at St. Mary's on Sundays: 8:45-9:15am.

Anointing of the Sick: Celebrated after masses when requested or by appointment.

Marriage: Engaged couples should contact the parish at least six months in advance of a desired wedding date.

Bulletin: Submissions for bulletin must be submitted to Kim Primo ten days prior to the first date of inclusion. Bulletin items will be included two weeks prior to event with advanced notice included 2 months prior. All submissions subject to approval/editing.

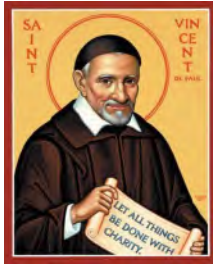

Thank you for supporting this ministry.

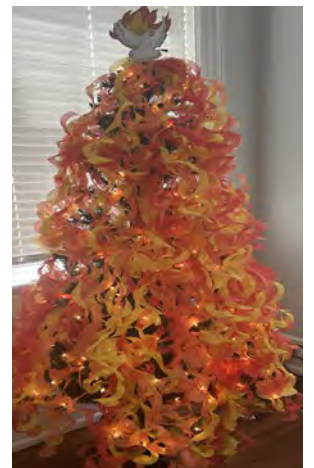

Catholic Traditions Explained:

Why do we use incense at Mass?

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).

Meet our Seminarians

Hello, my name is Jack Domark, and I am from Virginia Beach, Virginia. I love spending time with family and friends, playing sports, and combining those two activities at the beach! Growing up, I went to Catholic High School and attended St Gregory the Great Catholic Church. During my freshman year of high school, I was inspired by the great joy that my friends had from their relationship with Jesus, and it moved me to start taking my faith more seriously. Over the summer after my freshman year, I was at a retreat with my friends, and during Eucharistic Adoration, I encountered God's overwhelming love for me. I fell so in love with God and began to pray more. Through prayer, I came to love God more and share in His love for souls. As I was preparing for college, I was deciding between two schools, but I got most excited when thinking about the priesthood. Many trusted mentors and friends helped me to take a step towards seminary, and now I am starting my fourth year of seminary this Fall. I attend St John Paul II Seminary in Washington DC, and my time in formation has been such a gift. I am excited to get to meet the Peninsula Cluster Community this Summer! God Bless!

Hi, my name is Carl Baumann, and I'm excited to join you at the Peninsula Cluster this summer. I enjoy playing guitar, aviation, good stories, playing sports, and being outdoors. I grew up in Chantilly, Virginia in a Catholic family with one younger sister. I came to the Richmond Diocese in 2017 to study aviation at Liberty University. After graduation, I worked for the school as a flight instructor for over three years. During that time, a struggle with chronic health symptoms shook up my life, and for the first time, I began to realize my need for God. My recovery journey has been closely linked to a rediscovery of the Catholic Faith. This reached a high point three years ago when I broke up with my girlfriend to discern a call to the priesthood. After a period of wrestling, I gradually began to realize that the priesthood is not just something Jesus wants of me but something I want as well. Before beginning seminary, I completed an internship year at two parishes in the Diocese: Holy Cross in Lynchburg and Holy Comforter in Charlottesville.

Going forward, I will continue seminary at Theological College in Washington, DC. I have six years left until ordination to the priesthood. 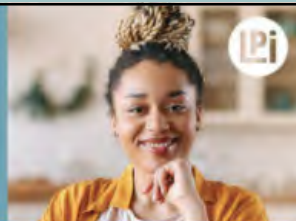
